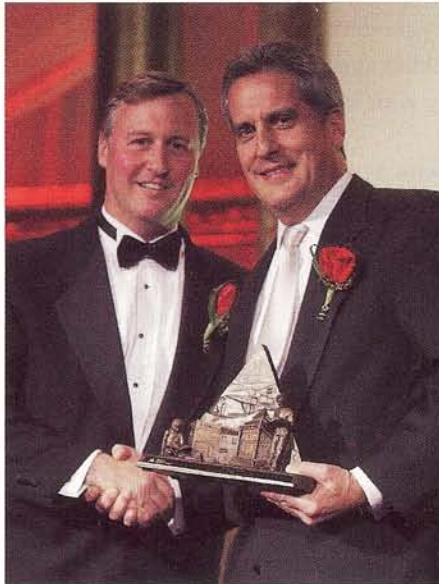
The Washington Business Hall of Fame honored five new laureates and raised more than \$1 million for Junior Achievement.



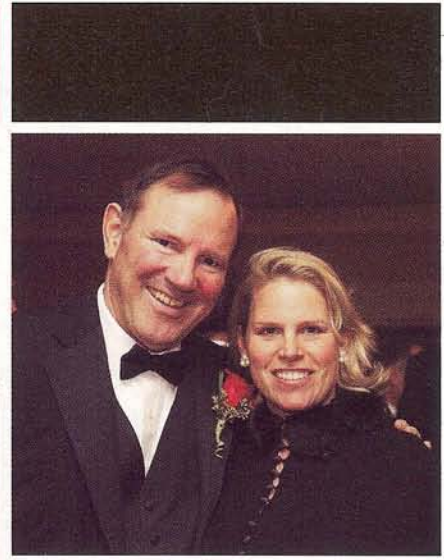

■ Washington Capitals chair Ted Leonsis and James Kimsey, a 2000 laureate. Both have been leaders of AOL.



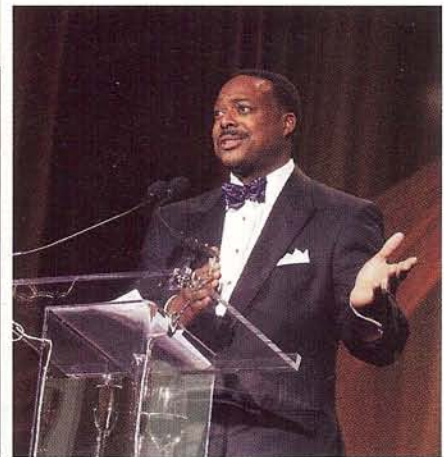
■ Junior Achievement president Edward Grenier congratulated Hall of Fame dinner chair Steven Snider for raising \$1.1 million for JA programs.



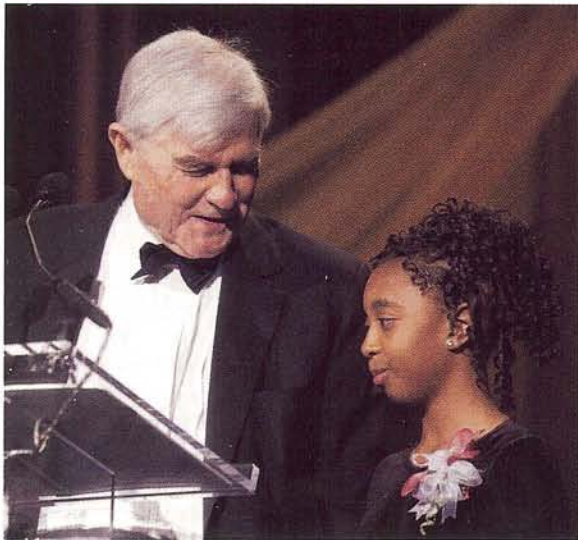

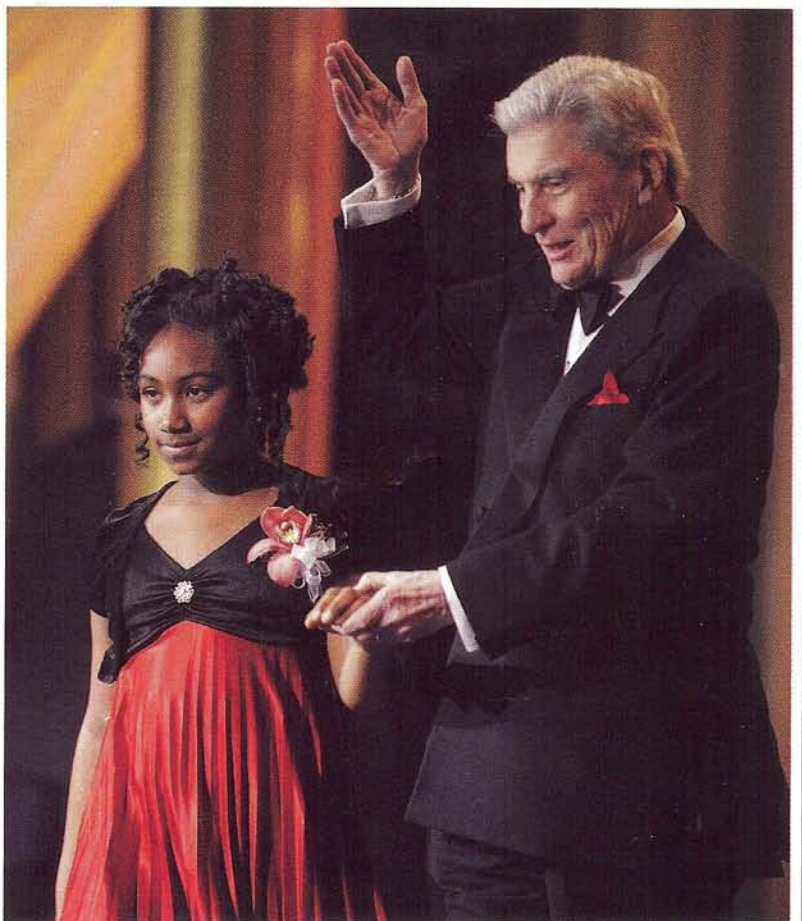
