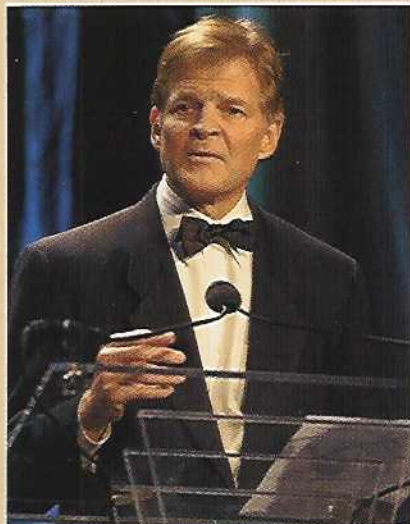


# Business Honors Its Best
