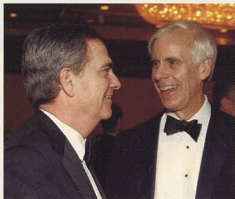

The Washington Business Hall of Fame celebrated five new laureates and raised \$1.4 million for Junior Achievement

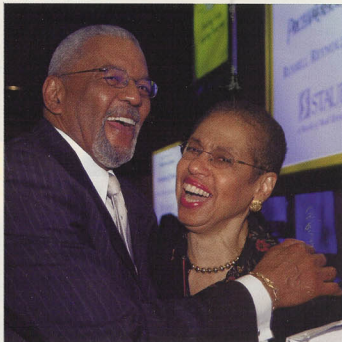

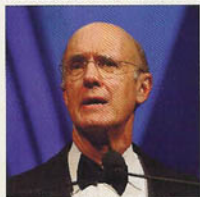
