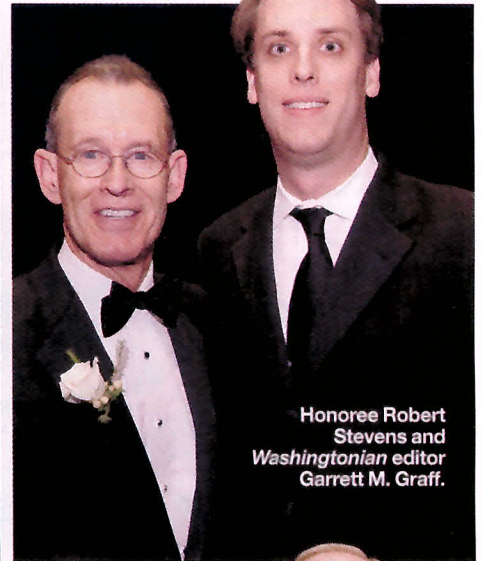


# Best in Business

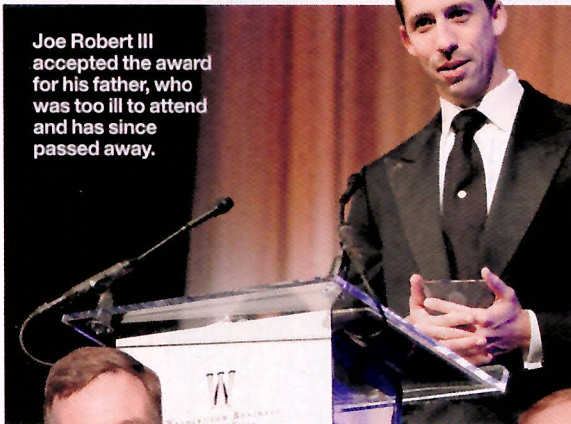
The Washington Business Hall of Fame honored five new laureates and raised more than a million dollars for Junior Achievement

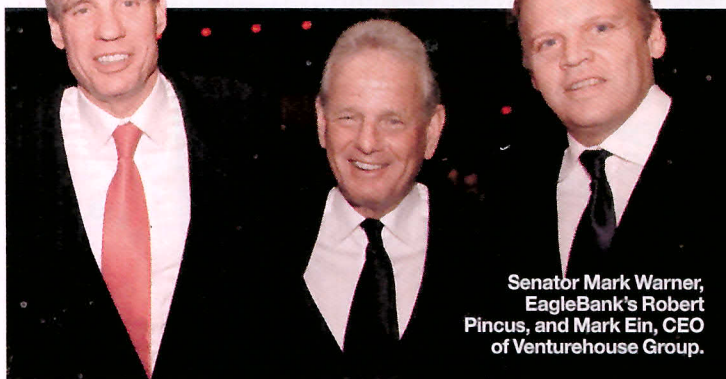
Honoree Robert Stevens and *Washingtonian* editor Garrett M. Graff.
